She was given Cedox, Prednisone, Nicotral inhaler, and Wellbutrin. The patient was to return in 2 weeks for a pap smear.</p>	<p><u>Otitis Media</u>-inflammation of the middle ear</p> <p><u>Cedox</u>-antibiotic</p> <p><u>Prednisone</u>-steroid</p> <p><u>Wellbutrin</u>-antidepressant (sometimes used to stop smoking)</p>
2-17-00	Hillside Care Center/ 000113	Paul Mosley, D.O.	<p><u>Clinic Note.</u> The patient presented to the clinic with complaints of sharp, burning pain to her left breast, which started 2 weeks prior to this visit. The patient stated the pain occurred 2-3 times a day.</p> <p>The patient drank 4-6 cokes a day and she smoked one and a half packs of cigarettes daily.</p> <p>The breast exam findings were: <u>Left Breast:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No dimpling • No nipple retraction • Positive Fibrocystic Disease 	<p>According to Dr. Smith, expert witness, It was uncertain what difference two months would have made to the ultimate outcome. It was clear, however, that if a mammogram and diagnostic testing had been ordered on February 17, 2000, the breast malignancy would not have evolved into an inoperable inflammatory breast cancer.</p> <p>Dr. Jones, expert witness, reflected that fibrocystic disease is a clinical diagnosis</p>

Therefore, it was impossible from the chart review to know if there were any objective findings consistent with inflammatory breast cancer. The patient's symptoms of burning pains are not consistent with fibrocystic breast disease. The patient was told to return to the clinic if not better, and there was no time period specified in which that should occur. Dr. Mosley did not note whether he counseled the patient regarding signs and symptoms of breast cancer and the need for a timely follow up.</p> <p><u>Arthrotec</u>-non-steroidal anti-inflammatory pain medication.</p>
